Notes

Throughout this piece, performers interact with a lantern which the soprano has found hanging centre stage. The lantern emits strange sound and light which ultimately overwhelm the soprano, after which she finds herself in a garden where there is a little bird asleep in a tree, screaming.



Comprehensive percussion List

Percussion 1 - 3 pairs of high, different pitched finger cymbals or similar resonant metals etc., Plastic Recorder, Piano, Vibraphone, Whirly, Brake drum and 4 other small to medium sized different pitched resonant metal objects, thumb piano, glockenspiel, Eb Almglocken/gong, Bb Almglocken,

Percussion 2 - Glockenspiel, Plastic recorder, Whirly (Open corrugated plastic tube which is twirled over one's head to produce harmonics.)
Medium/small sized tin can with serrated side, Tambourine, large circus drum.
Medium sized Flower pot, 48 Cardamom seeds, Thumb piano, Jew's Harp, Shaker, Snare drum, small tam-tam.

Percussion by Movement

Percussion 1 – 3 pairs of high, different pitched finger cymbals, resonant metals etc., Plastic Recorder, Piano, brake drum.

Percussion 2 – Glockenspiel, Plastic recorder, Whirly

*Each player should use different pitched recorders - (pitch is typically indicated with a letter above thumb whole) - E and B are preferable
Each percussionist plays recorder and bell parts simultaneously.
As each recorder can only be played with each hand, each attack should be at a random pitch using the first three holes of the recorder plus the thumb whole.

**On piano keyboard indicated notes should be silently depressed and the sostenuto pedal held with a brick or a foot before the piece begins. This may require more than one person.

Percussion 1 – Vibraphone, Eb Gong,

Percussion 2 - Medium/small sized tin-can with serrated side, Whirly, Tambourine, large circus drum, small tam-tam

*Tin-can played as one would play a guiro, using plastic wire brushes to make quiet rapid gestures.

Percussion 1 – 5 small to medium sized different pitched resonant metal objects, thumb piano, glockenspiel.

*Thumb piano should be slightly out of tune, half way between non-pitched resonant metals and the glockenspiel.

Percussion 2 – Medium sized Flower pot, 48 Cardamom seeds

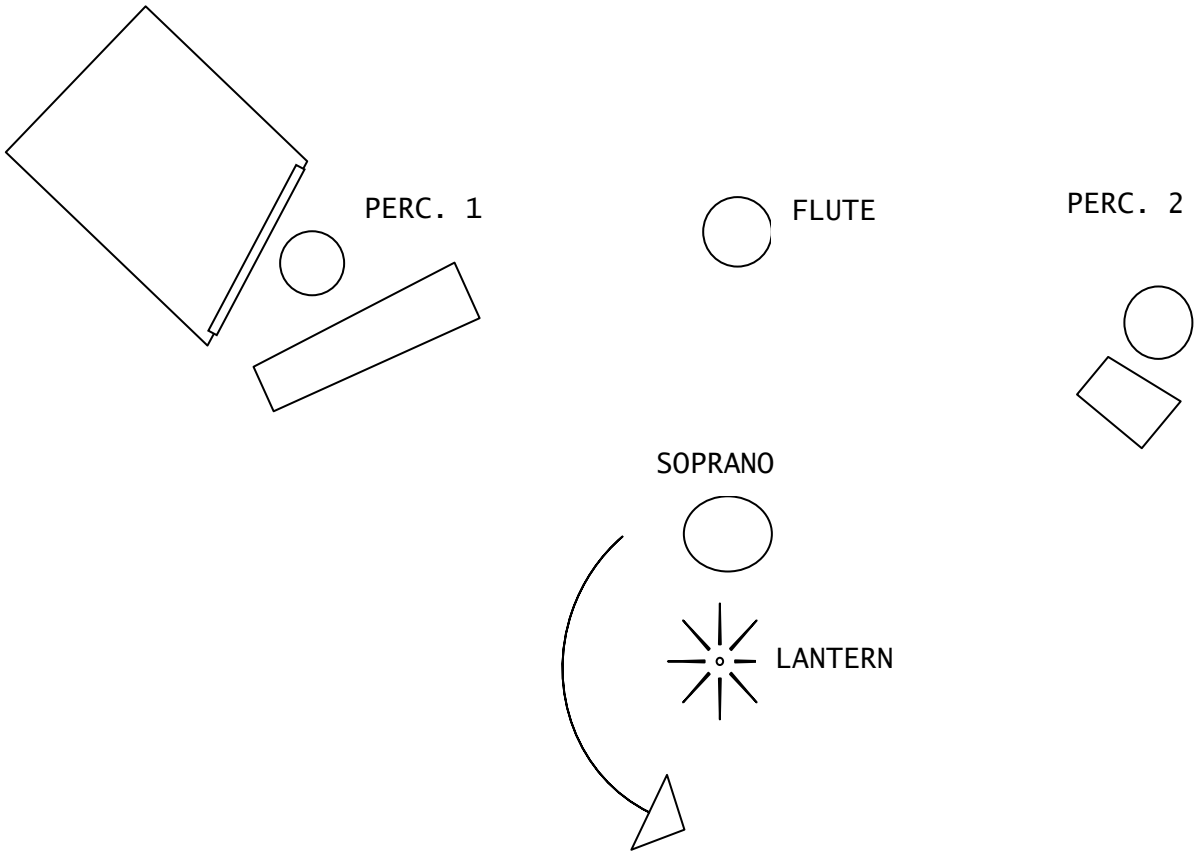
Flute

- Timbral trills achieved by trilling the key indicated in parenthesis. Where two trills are indicated, alternate irregularly between the two.
- Multiphonic taken from Robert Dick's *The Other Flute*. If the performer is able to find a multiphonic which speaks more successfully on his/her instrument, and includes pitch classes G, Ab, or D, please feel free to substitute it for the one indicated.
- 'WT' indicates Whistle Tone
- **T.R** indicates **Tongue ram**, "created by closing the mouthpiece with the whole mouth, and then making a big and very rapid movement with the tongue, against the teeth. The easiest way is to say "HOT!" or "HT!" The tone which is produced will sound a major seventh below the fingered one." (Mats Moller)
- 'Sing' = sing lower note into instrument whilst playing higher note.

Soprano

- crossed note-heads indicate **Sprechstimme**, a cross between speaking and singing in which the tone quality of speech is heightened and lowered in pitch along melodic contours indicated
- A stem with no note head indicates the text should be spoken in rhythm.






